### Knit a Square for SHARE

Pictured at the foot of the page are the Estuary and Mountain Mission Area's youth group, Journey of Youth or JoY@TheHub, preparing their initiative 'Knit a Square for SHARE' supporting homeless and refugees everywhere. Residents, schools, churches, families throughout the Mission Area including all on Halkyn Mountain and reaching as far as Mostyn, Flint, Lixwm and Holywell, were asked to knit six inch squares or to give a donation for materials. Friends and families all gathered for an evening of worship, fun and pizza in 'The Big Stitch Up' to sew the blankets, build refugee tents, follow the stories of real refugee families and celebrate their communities. The result has been an amazing **thirty** blankets donated to SHARE's work for refugees.

Flintshire Youth Volunteer Awards were granted to the young people who had dedicated more than 10 hours of their time. The JoY Group were granted Gold Awards for the thirty hours committed in the creation of the project reaching throughout the Mission Area and pictured below are the Silver Award winners from Ysgol Maesglas, who committed over twenty hours in their lunchtime knitting club, as they deliver the blankets to SHARE. From a small idea grew a massive community effort, led by our JoY group and bringing great hope for the future in the Estuary and Mountain Mission Area and beyond.





## **County Councillor**

Although our summer seems to be teasing us with changeable weather, we are fortunate not to be suffering from extremes of heat and the consequent terrifying fires which are rampant in other parts of Europe and especially the Mediterranean region.

It was most encouraging to see a fair number of people attending the Terrier Races - the usual prelude to the Rhes y Cae and Moel y Crio Sheepdog Trials and Gymkhana. In spite of the rain, everyone enjoyed the event, including the dogs. The weather forecast for the Saturday may well have put some people off but there was still an appreciable attendance and the day was a success. We are deeply indebted to the Chairman of the Sheepdog Trials, Mr Brian Coleclough, and his very hard working band of helpers. It is a significant and worthy achievement that such a small area and community can produce a worthwhile and pleasant occasion.

It was rather a sad occasion when the last drinks were served by Steve Marquis and his wife, Ness, on Sunday evening 30<sup>th</sup> of July at the Blue Bell Inn, Halkyn. The Marquis family, including Tom, have been very active and supportive members of the community for quite a while. In our own individual ways we will miss them very much. Through Steve's energy and initiative the Blue Bell has been a centre of interest and activity and especially has provided a wide variety of entertainment. Thank you, Steve, Ness and Tom for all the pleasure and warm welcomes you have given us. We wish you joy and peace in your new home in Scotland.

A small group of us will certainly miss one valuable service you provided: that of a local Post office. Personally, I found the service of very great value. Whenever possible the local P.O. rendered an excellent function by saving journeys to Mold. It was a great pity that this vital service was so restricted by higher and remote P.O. authorities. One cannot help thinking that the Post Office is deliberately engaged in self destruction. There seems to be a negative attitude at postal headquarters. Electronic messaging devices and e-mails are a great help, and of value, but the Post office has shown a deplorable lack of initiative and development. Not so long ago there was a body known as 'Postwatch'; people from various walks of life served as voluntary, unpaid members on this committee. They were able to comment constructively on postal services and make suggestions for the improvement of various departments of the Post Office. Sadly, 'Postwatch' was disbanded some years ago, thus the Post office lost its vital link with customers and consequently suffered from ignorance of what its 'grass roots' needed or desired.

Street lighting is a perpetual problem. Both Phillip Parry, Clerk to Halkyn Community Council, and I have been tackling this continuing problem. We have been assured that the matter is receiving attention and yet, to everyone's frustration and exasperation, very little progress has been made. The number of lights which are on during the daytime seem to increase. On the other hand some unfortunate folk have to endure defective or non-existing lighting despite repeated cries for help. One of the reasons cited for the delay is that the correct vehicles (cherry-pickers) are not available or the ground adjacent to the lights is too soft to provide a

secure base for this equipment. How was it then that several decades ago the present faulty poles were erected in the first place? Earlier this year I was fascinated and impressed while watching a new pole being erected in an almost inaccessible part of my garden. A team of eight men, using special tackle and pulleys achieved what appeared to be impossible.

Once again, mention must be made about speed limits, or rather the lack of them. Halkyn, Pentre Halkyn and Rhosesmor now have reasonable limits, which are monitored by the police. Over twenty cases of exceeding the limit were recorded one morning in July. So far it has been impossible to obtain any speed limit through Rhes y Cae. It is legally possible (though it would be careless/dangerous driving) to drive at speeds up to 60mph through a blind 'S' bend with houses on both sides of the road in which children live. Nearly half a century ago there was a small accident outside Rhes v Cae post office. When residents asked for a speed limit to be applied the extraordinary answer was, "There has to be a death in an accident before a speed limit can be applied". I sincerely hope this is not the case now.

Although we are living in uncertain times, I wish all the good folk on Halkyn Mountain a very pleasant and satisfying autumn.

#### **Funding**

The application for funding from the RDP Sustainable Management Scheme is well on the way to being completed. It has to be presented by 1<sup>st</sup> September and we should hear the result in January. The present funding from Chester Zoo is due to finish at the end of December. We have the opportunity to apply for further funding during the month of December, we think this will be for another three year period.

#### Dogs

We had another incidence of a dog killing a lamb in May, but in this case the incident was witnessed by someone walking on the mountain who managed to take photographs and the name of the dog owner. The details were passed on to the police and the dog owner received a Community Resolution and was ordered to pay full compensation to the owner of the lamb.

#### Scab prevention measures Clearing the mountain of sheep

As is normal practice the mountain is to be cleared of all sheep on SUNDAY 17<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER
BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 10 AND 12AM. The sheep are to be returned to the mountain only after they have received an approved treatment for scab.
The Association would be grateful to receive the cooperation of all the graziers. It is to all our advantage that sheep remain in a healthy disease free condition.

# Councillor Brian Coleclough (above) 50 years' Service to the Community

At a recent Halkyn Community Council meeting, Councillor Brian Coleclough was congratulated by the Immediate Past Chair of Council, Councillor David Hughes, on behalf of the Community Council, and he presented to Councillor Coleclough bilingually engraved glassware, to commemorate Councillor Coleclough's 50 years of service, as a Parish and Community Councillor for Halkyn (The Nant). Councillor Hughes thanked Councillor Coleclough for his "sterling public service to the Community, which has been greatly appreciated". Councillor Coleclough thanked the Council Members for the glassware, and stated: "that the time over the years had moved quite quickly and the Council still discuss similar matters throughout his 50 years as a Councillor".

# New Council Wards, Council Members, Chair & Deputy

Following a review by the Boundary Commission for Wales, the Council Wards of Halkyn, Pentre Halkyn, Rhosesmor and Rhes y Cae have been renamed and amalgamated to Halkyn Mountain and Pentre Halkyn Wards. The Halkyn Mountain Ward has 8 Councillors, together with 5 Councillors in the Pentre Halkyn Ward. As the election was uncontested in both Wards, four Councillors were co-opted. The following are Councillors in the Halkyn Mountain Ward: Colin Barker, L. Howard Morris, Mrs. Nicola Richardson, David G. Roberts, G. T. Robinson, Mrs. J. Wendy Sigsworth, Mrs. Delyth Taylor and John Thomas. The following are Councillors' in the Pentre Halkyn Ward: Brian Coleclough, B. Glyn Coleclough, Miss Jean S. Davies (Community & County), David A. Hughes and Dylan Roberts.

At the Annual Council meeting held in May, Councillor B. Glyn Coleclough (The Nant) was elected as Chair of Council. Councillor Mrs. Nicola Richardson (Rhes y Cae) was elected as Vice Chair of the Council.

# Dog Control Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in Flintshire:

Flintshire County Council have recently held a consultation, in relation a new PSPO. The Community Council were being asked to identify their land, either leased or owned, which required the PSPO to cover as follows: 'Open Spaces land within the Council's responsibility, for inclusion in a consultation on the implementing of a Dog Control Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in Flintshire. Following discussion, the Councillors agreed the following: As the Community Council do not own or lease land that would fall into this category, the Members would wish the following areas be covered by the new PSPO: (a) Children's Play Areas: Halkyn, Pentre Halkyn, Rhes y Cae and Rhosesmor (b) Rhos Helyg School, Berth Ddu, Rhosesmor (c) Places of Worship: Christchurch, Rhes y Cae, St. Mary's, Halkyn, St. Paul's, Rhosesmor. (Council Cemetery in St. Mary's, Halkyn and closed Cemetery near the Britannia Inn in Halkyn).



### Age is just a number!

Sue Bethell, from Rhes-y-Cae, took the Best Female Deadlift trophy at the World Drug Free Powerlifting Federation's (WDFPF) Single Lifts Championships in Antwerp, Belgium in June.

Lifting for Wales, aged 57 and at a bodyweight of 51.8 kg Sue pulled 151.5 kg to break her own world record in her age and weight category and



claim the overall title, calculated using the Malone formula based on bodyweight and weight lifted. This formula ignores age, so Sue was competing against all the youngsters.

#### How Active are You?

Most people are familiar with the government guidelines to undertake moderate intensity activity for 150 minutes each week, a recommendation that has been around for yonks. If you like to work hard and get a real sweat up then 75 minutes of vigorous activity will give you the same benefits.

But do you know, the current UK physical activity guidelines for adults also suggest that:

- all adults should undertake activity to improve muscle strength on at least two days per week
- all adults should minimise sitting for extended periods of time
- older adults at risk of falls should incorporate activity to improve their balance and co-ordination on at least two days per week

Ideally, we should all incorporate activity to improve our balance and coordination to help keep us out of the "at risk of falls" category.

### Don't Forget to Breathe

We all know why breathing is so important and yet most of do not breathe as well as we could, affecting our health adversely. How so?

How we breathe affects the amount of carbon dioxide and oxygen we have in our blood. Too much carbon dioxide will give us acid blood (like too much in the air gives us acid rain). The acid balance of our blood directly affects the functioning of our hormones and almost everything else. If we breathe correctly our body is more likely to function correctly.

If we breathe incorrectly we may start to overuse muscles, particularly in the shoulders and neck, which can lead to chronic neck and shoulder problems.

Shallow breathing does not allow us to de-stress whereas deep abdominal breathing triggers the relaxation response which is the opposite of the fight/flight or stress response.

In my experience, if you suffer from stress, tight muscles and general bodily discomfort, the single most effective thing you can do is to learn to breathe properly. Going and getting exercise is essential and may help aerate your body, but this is only a temporary fix if your breathing is dysfunctional.

Just imagine somebody who is stressed or anxious; they are breathing fast and shallowly, or they are not breathing at all. You can try breathing fast and shallowly (if you do not have a lung problem or suffer from panic attacks) for a moment. How does it feel? Now try breathing slowly and deeply. How does that compare? When you feel angry or nervous before making a presentation the best thing to do is to stop and take a few deep breaths.

When you breathe in, your abdomen should expand outwards, your lower rib cage should expand sideways and your upper rib-cage should expand forward just a little. Your shoulders should not lift and when you look in the mirror you should see no movement in the muscles of your neck. You can use your hands to feel the expansion in these different areas.

Retraining breathing takes time and sensitivity. You need to practise full breathing every day for five minutes or so and you should stop and take a full deep breath a couple of times an hour. If you do this for three months you will reprogramme your brain's automatic control of your breath. If you find it hard and there is a lot of tension in your abdomen then you may benefit from a gentle massage.

If you suffer from any heart or lung disorder please consult your doctor before trying to alter your breathing as your body may react to changes in the chemistry it has got used to.

Remember don't try too hard, be gentle and allow time to change and you will really transform how you feel through your breath.

While grazing in my field and enjoying the warm summer sun, I have plenty of time to think and to ponder the world around me. Although it may look as if I am only concentrating on eating, I am actually very much aware of all that is going on around me. When I return to my stable at night and during rainy days I think about all that I have seen and this week I have been thinking a lot about food and eating.

For much of the year, I only have to wander out of my stable and I am surrounded by food. I can choose what to eat from the selection of grasses and plants growing. In winter my human friends bring me hay and also some very tasty dry food. So the point I am getting to is that for most of the time I don't have to think about searching for food or chasing for it, although I have been known to run, when someone is heading in my direction with carrots or apples. Also, I am lucky that nobody tries to steal my food. The sheep do poke their heads through the fence from time to time and eat some grass, and rabbits often eat the odd leaf or two, but nothing to cause me any worry.

My human friends share their stable with a cat. and I have watched his daily challenge to keep and eat all his dinner. In the summer he eats outside and our human friends put food in his dish and then they return to their stable. At this time a magpie will be sitting in the nearby tree. He seems to know what time the food arrives and is always waiting. He then flies down and starts making an awful fuss. He tries to scare the cat away, but the cat now knows what he is doing as, if he were to step away from the bowl, the magpie will steal some food and fly back to its nest. There have been times when the cat has been away when the food has arrived and the magpie flies back and forth to its nest carrying food to feed its family. My mother once told me that cats eat special food which only cats should eat and I was warned never to try eating it. I don't think the magpie knows this. So if you ever hear magpies meowing or purring, you will know

why, and remember, you read it here first!

My human friends are very different. During most of the year I never see them eating. I have never ever seen them grazing in the field. However on a few occasions during the summer, they bring out a metal box and set it on fire. They then put food on top and watch it burn. Once it has been burning for a while they then eat it. It seems a very strange ritual to me. I can't imagine how burnt grass or hay would taste but the thought of it is bad enough. Perhaps this strange diet explains why they only have fur left on top of their heads. My mother once told me that I needed to eat well to keep a nice furry coat.

I'm glad my food is available in my field at any time I want it. If I fancy a snack in the middle of the night, I don't have far to go. I am also very lucky not to have to worry about magpies stealing my grass or hay. All this talking about food is making me hungry, so I'll head off now and find a juicy thistle (or two).







