## POLICY STATEMENT & ACTION PLAN 2021 – 2026

This report has been prepared in accordance with the Environment (Wales) Act 2016 Part 1 – Section 6, the Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystems Duty.

The administrative area of Halkyn Community Council covers the following villages: Halkyn, Moel Y Crio, Pentre Halkyn, Rhes Y Cae, Rhosesmor, The Nant, The Wern and The Windmill. The population of the area is 2,533 (January 2023 Register of Electors).

The Halkyn Community Council precept for the financial year 2023 / 2024 is £50,000.00. This amount is precept on residential properties within the community, and equates to a figure of £36.67 per household on a Band D property.

At the current time, Halkyn Community Council does not have direct responsibility for any green spaces but are actively supporting the local biodiversity through a number of initiatives – as detailed below
